What to do at the scene if you're injured

Getting the right medical treatment after a crash often starts at the scene. What you do in those first moments can affect both your recovery and your ability to pursue a claim. If you're hurt, make sure to:

- **Call 911 right away.** Emergency responders can provide immediate care and transport you if needed.
- **Don't ignore pain.** Even if injuries seem "minor," let paramedics evaluate you. Adrenaline can mask serious harm, and other injuries may have delayed symptoms.
- **Document what you can.** If possible, take photos of the vehicles, the accident scene, and visible injuries.
- **Get witness information.** Anyone who saw what happened may be helpful later in proving your case.

Remember, health comes first. Accepting medical treatment at the scene ensures injuries are recognized and addressed before they worsen.

Common car accident injuries

The type of medical treatment you need depends on the injuries you've sustained. Car accidents put a lot of strain on the body, and even low-speed collisions can cause lasting harm. Some of the most common injuries include:

- [Whiplash](#) and **soft tissue injuries** from sudden jolts to the neck and back.

- **Fractures and broken bones** caused by impact or being thrown against the inside of the vehicle.
- **Head injuries** ranging from [concussions](#) to [traumatic brain injuries](#).
- **Spinal cord injuries and [back pain](#)** that may lead to long-term mobility issues.
- **Cuts, bruises, and internal injuries** from seatbelts, airbags, or shattered glass.

Each of these injuries requires different forms of treatment, whether that's physical therapy, surgery, or ongoing rehabilitation.

Common medical treatment options after a car accident

Recovering from a car accident often requires a range of medical treatments, depending on the severity and type of injuries involved. From emergency care on the day of the crash to long-term rehabilitation, each step plays an important role in your health and recovery. Medical records from these treatments not only guide your healing but also serve as key evidence if you pursue an injury claim. Common treatment options NYC car accident victims may need include:

- **Emergency care and hospitalization:** When injuries are serious or life-threatening – such as internal bleeding, head trauma, or broken bones – emergency treatment is essential. Doctors stabilize critical conditions, and in many cases, patients are admitted for observation.
- **Surgery:** When non-invasive care doesn't resolve the problem, surgery may be required. Operations are often necessary to repair fractures, torn ligaments, or herniated discs that press on nerves.
- **Physical therapy and rehabilitation:** Physical therapy is one of the most common forms of treatment after a crash. It helps restore strength, flexibility, and range of motion in injured areas. Sessions may involve manual therapy, guided stretches, strength-building exercises, aquatic therapy, or gait training. This type of care is especially important for musculoskeletal injuries to the neck, back, shoulders, or knees.
- **Chiropractic treatment:** For certain back or neck issues, chiropractic treatment may be recommended alongside traditional medical care. Chiropractors focus on spinal alignment, soft tissue mobilization, and adjustments that can relieve pressure and reduce pain. While helpful in many cases, chiropractic care is usually best when paired with oversight from a physician, especially for more serious injuries.
- **Injections for pain relief:** Injections can be an important tool for managing moderate to severe pain. Doctors may use corticosteroid injections to reduce inflammation, epidurals for lower back pain, or nerve blocks to target specific pain pathways. These treatments can provide relief, especially when other methods like oral medications aren't effective on their own.

- **Massage therapy:** Massage therapy can help relieve muscle tension, improve circulation, and reduce chronic pain after a crash. It's often used alongside physical therapy to speed up recovery and restore mobility.
- **Pain management and medications:** Pain control is an essential part of recovery. Depending on the severity of symptoms, treatment may involve over-the-counter medications, prescription pain relievers, muscle relaxers, or corticosteroid injections.
- **Diagnostic testing and specialist referrals:** Accident-related injuries are not always obvious. Diagnostic tools such as MRIs, CT scans, ultrasounds, or nerve conduction studies can reveal hidden problems like herniated discs, nerve compression, or soft tissue tears. If a test shows a serious condition, your doctor may refer you to specialists, such as orthopedists, neurologists, neurosurgeons, or pain management experts.
- **Follow-up appointments:** Regular follow-up visits are essential to monitor your progress, adjust treatment plans, and ensure that injuries are healing properly. Keeping up with these appointments can help prevent complications, track recovery, and provide documentation that may be important for insurance claims or legal cases.
